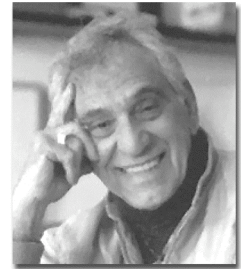


A WILL TO LIVE

The second revised edition of *A Will to Live*, the autobiography of Holocaust survivor, **George Ginzburg**, was launched in Melbourne, Australia on **2 December 2007**.

George Ginzburg is an active member of the Jewish community of Melbourne. Following the sell-out success of the first edition of *A Will to Live*, and great and varied ongoing interest in his story, he is delighted to release this revised edition of his book.

This autobiography is of impressive significance to the literary world. George is an eyewitness to some of the 20th century's most extraordinary and horrific events. From his early life in Germany to experiencing first-hand change and shame inflicted by the Nazis, George has overcome these trials to be a fit 83 year old who volunteers his time as a guide and lecturer at the Melbourne Holocaust Museum and Research Centre in Melbourne, Australia. His lectures target a mass audience of all denominations, with particular application for students of all ages interested in the history and atrocities of World War II. The many hundreds of people he meets from international and local backgrounds have repeatedly requested his story.

George's account is one of survival, intrigue, cunning, strength and betrayal. George speaks fluent English, French, German, Russian and Dutch. With these countries affected by Nazism, *A Will to Live* is of great interest internationally.

Specifically, the true account of George's daring escape from the infamous Death March is compelling reading. *A Will to Live* also describes how George joined the third United States Army CIC Black Hawk Panzer Division, which has particular significance in the world's current climate as he relates his experiences as a student, refugee, prisoner, soldier and immigrant.

A Will to Live has been highly successful in Australia and has been nominated for housing at the Rare Book Collection in The Australian Study of Jewish Civilisation Library at Monash University, Melbourne. It has been described as an 'unusual story of the strength of the human spirit and the spirit of hope, which can overcome even the most unthinkable circumstances.'
